

Reflecting on 2023 and Looking Forward to 2024


"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" (Psalm 133:1)

Ukraine - We have continued to gather to pray for Ukraine, both in the town centre and across the local churches. The most recent was at Locking Castle Church, marking 600 days

since the war started. Holy Trinity Elim, St Paul's and several other Churches are supporting the Ukrainian Community living in Weston. There is a Ukrainian hub in Waterloo Street.



AbbeyCare Homes, a local care charity have been running coffee mornings for people living in the town centre, raising awareness and supporting the needs of the elderly.



In Crisis Sheet - CTWD once again have partnered in the production of the In Crisis Sheet – managed by Key Steps, which is a useful resource for sign-posting people in need over the winter months. Links include mental health, benefits, housing, debt and food.
