Sunday, 24th March, the growing congregation at St Anne's, West Wick, Weston-



super-Mare, an out-reach congregation supported by Locking Castle Local Ecumenical Partnership, witnessed the signing of a **Declaration of Intent** by Bishop Peter Hancock (Bishop of Bath and Wells) and Revd Gary Woodall (Regional Minister of the West of England Baptist Association), supported by Major Alan Dixon on behalf of Churches Together in Somerset. The members of this informal missional community gathering were pleased to have the support of Church Leaders and the wider ecumenical community as they take a step into an unknown future with respect of being Church in their neighbourhood. The growing congregation and youth

Leaders of five Christian World Communions attended an ecumenical prayer service in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart at the University of Notre Dame in Indiana, United States, marking the opening of a four-day consultation of five Christian World Communions discussing the historic importance of the <u>Joint Declaration on the Doc-</u>

trine of Justification (JDDJ) and its impact on the search for full, visible unity of the church. The Lutheran World Federation (LWF) and the Roman Catholic Church signed the JDDJ on 31 October 1999 in Augsburg, Germany. It has since been joined or substantially affirmed by the World Methodist Council (WMC), the Anglican Communion and the World Communion of Reformed Churches (WCRC). The 26-28 March consultation



marks the first time that all five JDDJ partners have come together to see how the historic agreement can help move the churches closer toward their goal of Christian unity.

Fresh Expressions (FX) brought in a creative new structure and leadership model in March 2019 as Phil Potter completed his role as Team Leader. Phil Potter stepped down from his role as 'Archbishops' Missioner and Team Leader Fresh Expressions' after 5 years. As part of the process of change and in response to the rapidly changing nature of the Fresh Expressions movement in the UK, the organisation had engaged in a listening exercise across the movement and decided on some significant changes for 2019 resulting in a specific focus on 'connecting and catalyzing the fresh expressions movement' within a framework of "network of networks" rather than simply as a single organisation.
